## ANNE HALL

Growing up in a non-hunting household, it's no surprise that Anne Hall of Pennsylvania was anti-gun and anti-hunting. That stance changed after she attended her first Women in the Outdoors event in 2003.

At the event, she experienced many activities for the first time and met many women who shared a love of the outdoors. "No one made fun of anyone," Hall said. "Everyone encouraged each other."

Anne was introduced to firearms at that first event. And during the second one she participated in a turkey hunting class taught by Gene Alwine, former NWTF Pennsylvania State Chapter president.

Now, Hall hunts with a rifle, muzzleloader and bow, and has harvested turkey and deer. "Hunting has provided me so many opportunities to enjoy the outdoors," Hall said. "It's unbelievable." Anne shares the hunting tradition with her three sons, who have

developed an appreciation for the outdoors and hunting from their mom.

An active member of the NWTF Local Chapter 1, Hall serves on the Laurel Highlands Banquet Committee. "Attending the banquet affords me the opportunity to interact with wonderful individuals who share my passion for wildlife conservation," Hall said.

Through Women in the Outdoors, women of all ages learn about conservation, hunting and the outdoors. Women in the Outdoors events provide expert instructors to teach women a variety of fun activities they can share with their families, such as archery, outdoor cooking, camping, hunting, hiking and gardening for wildlife.

The NWTF's Women in the Outdoors program held nearly 350 events in 2008.
